

## Promoting Cultural Sensitivity in Supervision

**Description:** This four (4) hour workshop is designed to introduce counselors, therapists and medical personnel to the rapidly changing demographics of our society make it virtually mandatory for supervisors and clinicians to develop effective strategies for attending to issues of diversity throughout all domains of the clinical process. Even when the desire and commitment to be more culturally attuned are clear, possessing the “know how” to achieve such a lofty and often-difficult undertaking leaves many supervisors in a quandary. This session will provide an overview of the core principles of culturally sensitive supervision and provide participants with strategies for integrating race and other dimensions of diversity into the supervisory process. Special attention will be devoted to an exploration of relevant Self of the Supervisor issues that may facilitate and/or impede the process of supervision.

**Instructor: Dr. Kenneth Hardy** - Dr. Hardy is an internationally recognized clinician, author, and Trainer. He is also the Director of the Eikenberg Institute for Relationships in New York City where he maintains a private practice specializing in working with traumatized and oppressed populations.

**Course Objectives:** Attendees will be able to:

- ▶ Describe and apply the core principles that define culturally competent supervision;
- ▶ Utilize effective strategies to address toxic culturally-based messages that impact therapy and supervision;
- ▶ Analyze culturally-based Self of the Therapist/Supervisor issues that can impede and/or facilitate one’s ability to effectively navigate issues of race in therapy and supervision.
