Provides Equitable Access to CTE Programming

- Open to all Marin County high school students
- Located centrally at Terra Linda HS
- Offer classes in the afternoons, evenings, and weekends
- Provide transportation options for students across the county
- Increases the number of students who can participate in and benefit from CTE pathways, especially low-income, female, Latinx, and rural Marin students

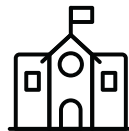
