Dear County and District Superintendents, Charter School Administrators, High School Principals, and High School Counselors:

CAL GRANT GRADE POINT AVERAGE SUBMISSION AND GRADUATION VERIFICATION CHANGES

It is our goal to provide our students with the best opportunities to succeed in high school and during their transition to higher education. As students are preparing for college, it is important that we work together to provide them with accurate and timely information about state-funded financial aid. Recent statutory changes have been made that will increase the effectiveness of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the California Dream Act Application (CADAA).

Effective January 1, 2017, changes to the California *Education Code (EC)* established new timelines for districts, charter schools, and public high schools regarding Cal Grants and graduation dates. Revisions to the *EC* are listed below:

- 1. EC 69432.9 (d)(1): No later than January 1 of a pupil's grade 11 academic year, school districts or charter schools must notify, in writing, each grade 11 pupil (and their parent or guardian if the pupil is under 18 years of age) that the pupil will be considered a Cal Grant applicant unless he or she opts out. Pupils and parents must be notified and given 30 days to opt out. The required notice shall indicate when the school will first send grade point averages (GPAs) to the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC).
- 2. EC 69432.9 (c)(2): No later than October 1 of each academic year, a Cal Grant GPA is required to be submitted electronically to the CSAC for all grade 12 pupils [except for those who opted out per EC 69432.9 (d)(1) at public high schools, including charter schools]. Social Security numbers shall not be included in the information submitted to the CSAC.
- 3. *EC* 69432.92 (b): As soon as possible after a pupil's graduation, and no later than **August 31** of the academic year following the pupil's graduation, all high schools and high school districts are required to verify the graduation date of

their pupils. This subdivision also applies to pupils who graduate during the summer following the grade 12 academic year.

The summary table below outlines important dates:

2018-19 Award Year (Class of 2018)

Date	Deadline
January 1, 2017	GPA opt out due (junior year)
May 1, 2017	2018–19 GPA submission window open
October 1, 2017	High school GPA deadline
October 1, 2017	2018–19 FAFSA/CADAA available
March 2, 2018	2018–19 FAFSA/CADAA deadline for Cal Grants
August 31, 2018	High school graduation verification deadline

Districts, high schools, and charter schools are strongly encouraged to prepare now for the earlier GPA submission requirement and to begin notifying the class of 2018 about their option to opt out no later than the end of their junior year. GPAs for the class of 2018 can be electronically submitted to the CSAC as of May 2017.
