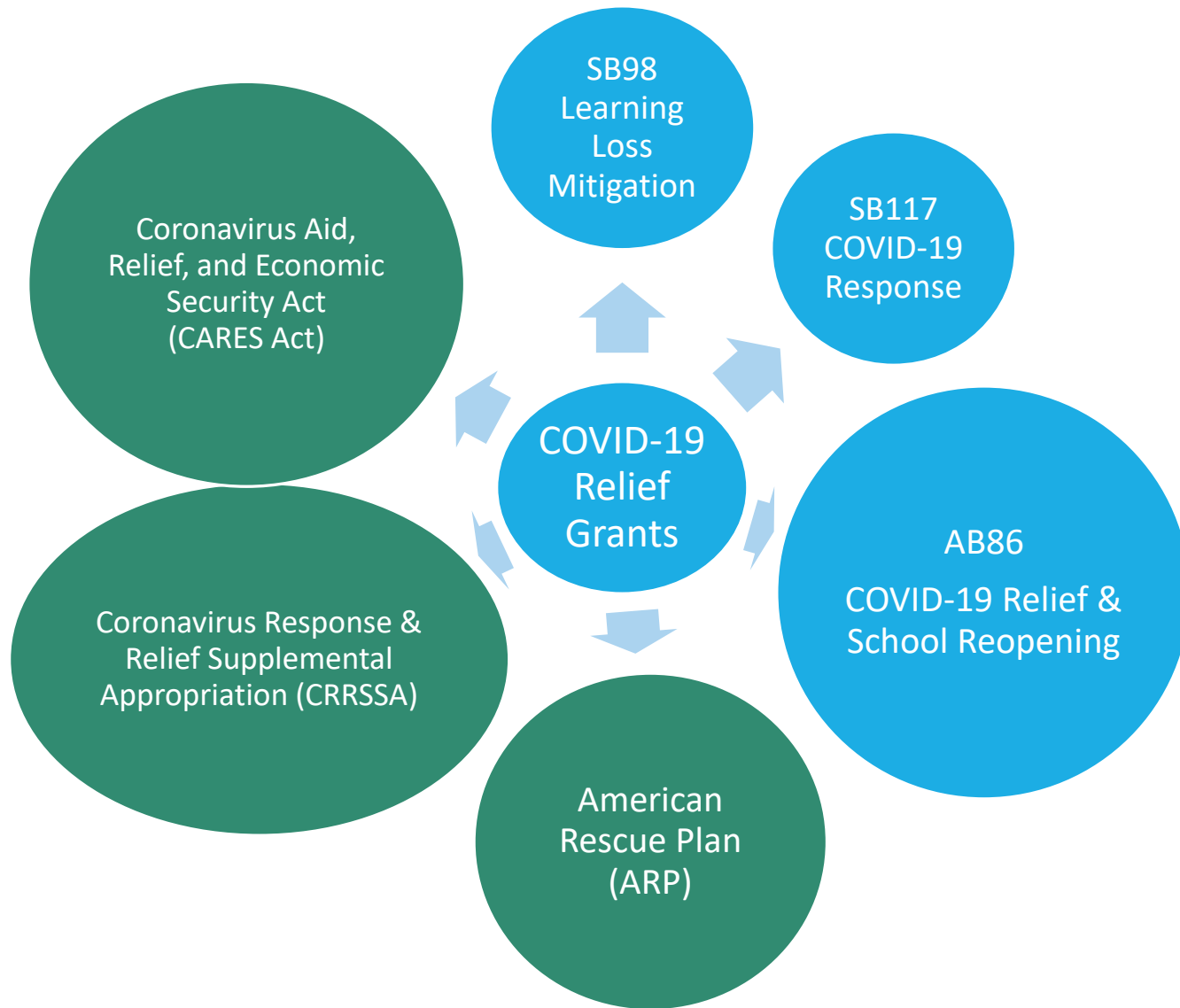

# COVID-19 Response Legislative Acts

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# Multiple grants

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- **COVID-19 LEA Response** grants were authorized by State Senate Bill 117 with grants of \$17.38 per unit of student attendance.
- **Learning Loss Mitigation (LLM)** grants were authorized by State Senate Bill 98 (SB98) using federal funds authorized under the CARES Act for education under the Governor's Emergency Education Fund (GEER) and Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) as well as state general funds. Funds were allocated based on local control funding formula apportionments meaning districts with higher numbers of Low Income, English Learner and Foster Youth received more.
- **Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER)** grants were authorized by all three rounds of federal stimulus: CARES Act, CRRSSA, and ARP, and are allocated using the Title I formula (based on census count of low-income pupils)
- **Expanded Learning Opportunity** and **In Person Instruction** grants were authorized by State Assembly Bill 86 (AB86) with funds allocated based on proportionate share of statewide local control funding formula.

# COVID-19 Relief Grant funding

Total one-time funding is equal to approximately 15% of the total annual revenue received for K-12 Education in Marin County

# Braiding resources

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We encourage you to **take a holistic approach** in using this one-time funding to best meet student needs.

- Start with **student needs**
- Determine the **most effective actions** to meet those needs
- Determine the **timeline to implement** those actions
- Determine the **means of measuring** success
- Finally, look at funding sources by **allowable uses and time restrictions** to determine how to best fund the plan

Don't forget to include **supplemental and concentration** grant funds and federal and state **categorical grants** in your planning
