

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE MULTI-COUNTY AGENCY CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE



What is the FPPC?

The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) administers and enforces ethics law, as well as informs and assists public officials, employees, and candidates on Political Reform Act compliance.

What is a Conflict of Interest Code?

Every year, the Marin County Office of Education is required, by the FPPC, to review its Conflict of Interest code to ensure it accurately identifies all agency officials and employees who make or participate in making governmental decisions, and who should be filing a Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700).

What is a Form 700?

Every elected official and public employee who makes or influences governmental decisions is required to submit a Form 700 to provide transparency and accountability to the public about personal financial interests, to ensure that officials are making decisions in the best interest of the public and not enhancing their personal finances.

Does the MCOE need to amend its conflict of interest code this year?

Yes. The MCOE is proposing one (additional designated position) change to the Conflict of Interest code. As part of the proposal to amend the code, and as required by the FPPC, the MCOE is conducting a 45-day public comment period to collect comments on the proposed change.

Public Comment Period: June 27th to August 10th

The public comment period will begin on Monday, June 27, 2022 at 8:00 am and end 45 days later on Wednesday, August 10th at 5:00 pm
