Currently the facility fee is paid through a set-aside of \$11,360 per classroom. The fee has not changed in many years.

This proposal provides the impact of keeping the fee as is vs raising it while also showing the difference between 7 net fees vs 9 with program expansion.

## **Special Education Concentration Grant**

Trailer bill language for the Governor's budget proposal includes an increase (\$576 million) for special education funding.

The monies are limited to local educational agencies (LEAs) (school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools) with an Unduplicated Pupil (foster youth, English Learners, students eligible for free and reduced price meals) Percentage (UPP) exceeding 55% and where the percentage of students with disabilities exceeds the state average. It is estimated that the statewide average rate of students with disabilities in grades Kindergarten through Twelfth (the student population defined by the trailer bill language) is approximately 10.93%. With those limiters, the grant would only be for the number of pupils above the statewide average within an LEA. Of the \$390 million in ongoing funding for this grant, the estimated per-pupil rate would be \$8,150. The one-time funding (\$187 million) for these same students is estimated at \$3,899 per pupil above the statewide average.

Using these estimations only Sausalito Marin City and Shoreline meet both the UPP % and have a percentage above the statewide average.



#### IDEA Full Funding Act

Bipartisan legislation designed to ensure Congress' commitment to fully fund the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). In 1975, Congress passed IDEA to ensure that every child with a disability has access to educational opportunity; however, the Act has never been funded as written. Specific details are not yet available; however, previous legislation in this area proposed to amend the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act to reauthorize and make appropriations for the grant program to assist states and outlying areas in providing special education and related services to children with disabilities as follows:

The bill intends to set the amount to be appropriated for each fiscal year from FY2018-FY2026 as the greater of: (1) a specified amount, or (2) a specified percentage of an amount determined pursuant to a formula that multiplies the number of children receiving special education services by the average per-pupil expenditure in public elementary and secondary schools. The bill shall appropriates funds for FY2027 and each subsequent fiscal year equal to the greater of a specified amount or 40% of the amount determined using such formula.

#### 1.0 Overview

This document includes information and costs for Marin County Office of Education to provide access to Kognito simulations on an unlimited basis for K-12 educators who are employed in any of the 19 school districts within Marin County. This proposal takes advantages of economies of scale by pooling the number of users across the County. Costs are presented in Section 8 below.

### 2.0 What we provide?



# 5.0 Implementing Kognito PK-12 Simulations in Schools

1. Professional Development Curriculum: – The At-Risk simulations address issues of student mental health and suicide prevention through enhancing the communications practices of adults. Connection with even one adult in the school building has been demonstrated to be a significant protective factor for students, and teacher/student connectedness is a key measure of school climate. Kognito's best practice implementation model is to train every adult who works in or around the school building: teachers, administrators, support staff, cafeteria workers, bus drivers, parent volunteers, paraprofessional staff, school resource officers, etc. Schools that have successfully implemented these trainings have tied them to various Professional Development themes including: suicide prevention, social emotional learning, cultural diversity and respect, and communications effectiveness.

# Implementation best practices follow two primary models: <u>3-Step Wraparound In-Service Training</u>

- Introduce At-Risk trainings in a brief staff meeting (using provided presentation materials) –
   10 minutes
- Staff members use school computers to train online individually using At-Risk 60 minutes
- Staff come back together to review school-specific policies and procedures regarding referrals and crises, as well as to debrief the learning experience (templates and discussion guide provided) - 50 minutes

Benefits: High quality in-service training requiring little preparation. Engages community in common understanding of issues, policies and procedures. Encourages discussion of actual challenges within the building and/or local community that extends beyond the event.

#### Flexible Professional Development Credit

- Use provided template to email staff rationale, instructions for training online, and deadline for completion;
- Staff completes individual training online at school, home on their own time or during prep time. Some administrators have swapped a weekly staff meeting for this self-paced activity
- Staff submit certificate of completion to verify participation or administrators has the access to view this information online if an account is created
- Staff debrief conducted as a follow up meeting.

Benefits: High quality professional development activity that allows all staff to train when/where convenient.

2. Student Curriculum – Friend2Friend is most often deployed as a learning activity (homework or classwork) for mental health and suicide prevention in Health Class curriculum (lesson plan provided). It has also been used as a club activity or homeroom activity.

#### 6.0 License Features

A multi-school license purchase includes access to the selected programs for all staff and volunteers serving students in the covered buildings, in addition to the following features:

- 1. <u>Hosting & Technical Support</u> Kognito will host the programs on its secure web server and provide technical support to all end users during normal business hours.
- 2. <u>User Account Management</u> Kognito will host the courses within its Learning Management System (LMS). Users of each course will be required to open an account to access the course by providing an email address and choosing a password. As a result, users will be able to complete the courses in multiple sittings (i.e. users can leave the training and come back to continue from the same spot since the LMS will "remember" their last location).
- 3. <u>Certificates of Completion</u> Users will be able to download and print a personalized certificate of completion at the end of each course.
- 4. <u>Surveys</u> Standard pre-, post- and follow-up surveys. Customization of survey questions incurs additional fees.
- 5. <u>Unlimited Access to the Course</u> Once users create an account to access a course, they will have unlimited access to it during the license term. This will allow users to come back to the course to refresh their knowledge and skills.
- 6. <u>Completion Reminders to Users</u> To increase completion rates, Kognito will email two reminders to users who registered, but have not completed the course within a certain amount of time.

# 7.0 Implementation Support Services

Kognito takes an active role in rolling-out, promoting, assessing and tracking the usage of the courses. These services will significantly reduce the time commitment and resources that clients will need to allocate to make these courses successful. In addition, many implementation support services will employ best practices that have been successfully utilized by Kognito clients, and shown effective. These services include:

- 1. <u>Usage Tracking Reports</u> The Kognito Learning Management System (LMS) maintains a record on the learning activities of each user. The client will have access to view this report which will detail the number of users, their completion rates, role, age, gender, and more.
- 2. <u>Customized Information on District-Level Support Services</u> Each course includes a link to a web page or downloadable document where users can view a list of the relevant services that are available to support youth. Kognito will customize this page based on information received from the client.
- 3. <a href="Implementation Support">Implementation Support</a> Kognito will host a one-hour online orientation for the client to learn about the program features, including how to access and user the administrative portal, and a 45-minute online rollout webinar to stakeholders. Kognito will also provide the client with a copy of its implementation manual. This manual includes best practices for promoting the courses to end users. These best practices have been collected from existing Kognito clients that have successfully rolled out in states, districts and schools across the country.
- 4. <u>Marketing Package</u> The package includes several marketing templates such as PowerPoint slides about the courses, and suggested language for announcing the courses' availability via email or in listservs and newsletters.

#### 8.0 Premium Consultative Services

Kognito can also provide additional services to support program implementation and assessment in cases where clients do not have in house resources to fulfill these roles. See costs in Section 8 below.

  at the district and school level through increased usage visibility. To accomplish this, Kognito will
  configure monthly automated reporting for school-based site champions based on contact
  information received from client.
- 2. Advanced Assessment Online pre, post, and 3-month follow-up surveys to assess longitudinal changes in knowledge, skills, perception, behavioral intention, and actual behavior (e.g., number of students approach or referred). Kognito will analyze the data using a repeated measure design and paired sample t-tests, delivering results in a comprehensive report at the end of the license term or mid-term and end of term for a multi-year contract.
- Program Stewardship Kognito can provide additional services for planning and rollout, including on-site kick off meeting and progress reports and strategy calls. Cost for these services are scoped based on discussions with client.
- 4. <u>Training and Technical Assistance for School-based Implementers</u> Kognito can provide training and technical assistance for each school-based implementer or implementation team at a cost of \$100/hour.

#### 9.0 Cost

Kognito simulations are sold as a turnkey subscription service that includes hosting and technical support, 24/7 access for end users, and a broad range of implementation support tools. Subscriptions can be bundled by individual users, schools, districts or statewide access. Kognito passes along economies of scale to clients so as the user pool grows (aggregating purchase by district or state, for example) the lower the effective cost per user. Institutional, access to unlimited licenses, permit the institution (i.e., school, district or state) to train any and all personnel of that institution for one annual cost. In addition, learners can log on and train as many times as they choose during the contract period.

The following quote for Marin County Office of Education is based on data from the California Department of Education. According to this database, the County comprises 19 school districts (including the County Office of Education) and approximately 1,857 full-time teachers serving 33,741 students in 179 schools. Costs presented below remain in effect through July 1, 2019.
