Special Education Local Plan Area Funding Distribution

Describe the basic premise of the SELPA Allocation Plan for distributing dollars as closely as possible to how they are earned.

The AB602 allocation plan provides for SELPA approved regional programs after which all state and local funds are allocated by current year ADA as earned. Federal dollars are allocated on a weighted formula 85% pupil count and 15% low-income count to mirror the manner in which earned. Educationally related mental health services revenues, both state and federal, are allocated to districts based on the number of students identified for mental health services with funding weighted according to intensity of service. This plan was developed and approved by SELPA members at the onset of the transfer of this funding stream. Preschool funds are allocated to districts offering regionalized preschool services based on the prior year pupil count of pupils served thereby allocating the revenues as earned.
